

**DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT'S ELIGIBILITY STATUS
FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

I. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The School Nutrition Services Section and the Division of Accountability Services of NC Department of Public Instruction acknowledge and agree that children's meal eligibility status obtained under provisions of the National School Lunch Act (42 USC 1751et. seq.) or Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 USC 1771 et. seq.) and subsequent amendments and the regulations implementing those Acts is confidential information and must be treated accordingly. This Agreement is intended to ensure that any information disclosed by the School Nutrition Administrators to the Testing Coordinators/Directors at the local level about children eligible for free and reduced price meals will be used only for purposes specified in this Agreement and for no other purpose(s). The School Nutrition Services section and the Division of Accountability Services recognize there are penalties for unauthorized disclosures of this eligibility information that are enforceable under the law.

II. AUTHORITY

Section 9(b)(2)(C)(iii) of the National School Lunch Act (42 USC 1758(b){2}(C)(iii) authorizes the limited disclosures of students' free and reduced price meal eligibility information to specific programs or individuals without prior parent/guardian consent. The parent/guardian must be provided the opportunity to decline to share eligibility information prior to the disclosure of this information for the purposes of identifying children eligible for benefits under or enrolling children in the State Medicaid Program and the State Children's Health Insurance Program. Additionally, the statute specifies that for any disclosures not authorized by the statute, the consent of children's parents/guardians must be obtained prior to the disclosure. Federal or State mandated education programs may have access to children's confidential meal eligibility status for reporting purposes only. Local education initiatives are ineligible to receive this confidential information without prior written consent of the parent/guardian.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES

The School Nutrition Services Section of the NC Department of Public Instruction will ensure the School Nutrition Programs in the Local Education Agencies will:

Ensure that the terms "free and reduced price meal eligibility status" or any other terms related to the National School Lunch Act are not used in the disclosure of student's economic status to the person(s) directly authorized to receive the information. Instead, any disclosure of student's eligibility for meal benefits under the National School Lunch Act (and subsequent Acts and Regulations) shall be disclosed as follows:

The following students are designated Economically Disadvantaged Students (EDS) for testing and reporting purposes pursuant to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (PL 107-110) as reauthorized by the No School Left Behind Act of 2001.

When required, secure parental/guardian consent prior to any disclosure not authorized by National School Lunch Act or any regulations under that Act, unless prior written consent is obtained from the parent/guardian;

For the State Medicaid Program and the State Children's Health Insurance Program, notify

parents/guardians of potential disclosures and provide an opportunity for parents/guardians to elect not to have information disclosed;

Disclose children's confidential meal eligibility status only to persons directly connected to the administration or enforcement of programs authorized access under the National School Lunch Act or regulations under the Act or to programs or services for which parents/guardians gave prior written consent;

Ensure any misuse of the information concerning student's socioeconomic status is reported immediately to the School Nutrition Services Section of the NC Department of Public Instruction; and

Notify the Division of Accountability Services of all MOAs established between School Nutrition Services and other organizational units within the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (DPI) whenever those MOAs involve individually identifiable EDS data.

The Division of Accountability Services will:

Serve as the authoritative data source for individual-level EDS data within DPI.

Ensure that access to EDS information is restricted to:

- persons within the LEA and/or institutional unit who are officially designated by the LEA Superintendent or institutional head as Testing Coordinators/Directors for North Carolina testing and accountability functions (see provided list at <http://www.ncpublicschools.org/accountability/moa>);
- persons currently employed as a Regional Accountability Coordinator (RAC) or Regional Computing Consultant (RCC) in the State's educational regions;
- persons in DPI authorized to have access under any MOA in effect between the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (DPI) School Nutrition Services and other organizational units of the DPI, insofar as the Division of Accountability Services has been informed by School Nutrition Services of the existence of such MOAs; and,
- Federal reporting requirements outlined the United States Department of Education (USED) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) per DPI Data Management Group (DMG) guidelines.

Ensure none of the information obtained from the School Nutrition Program may be downloaded or entered into Power School or any other data warehouse or data management system in any school or LEA.

Ensure none of the information obtained from the School Nutrition program may be disclosed to a third party for any purpose; disclosure to a third party constitutes a breach of the MOA and may result in revocation of the individual's, group's or program's authorization to receive the data in the future. Disclosure to an unauthorized individual or group may also be grounds for dismissal as agreed upon in the legally-binding agreement between the department and the LEA.

Use children's free and reduced price meal eligibility information for the following purpose(s):

A file containing student's confidential meal eligibility status, by school, will be provided to the Testing Coordinator/Director. The Testing Coordinator/Director will upload this information on December 1 and April 1 into the Division of

Accountability Services at DPI. The data will be used to: a) provide State and Federally-mandated reports of educational progress for North Carolina; b) comply with currently effective MOAs issued by School Nutrition Services to organizational units within the DPI; and c) satisfy DPI business requirements that may arise from time to time insofar as they are not in conflict with DPI policies or relevant Federal and State statutes cited in Sections I through III of this MOA.

Ensure that at no time will a student's individual identity be revealed except as required to meet statutory requirements or the provisions of currently effective MOAs issued by School Nutrition Services or Federal requirements of USED and USDA reporting.

Inform all persons that have access to EDS information of the following:

- (1) The information is confidential;
- (2) Student's confidential eligibility information must be used only for purposes specified above;
- (3) No mention of the terms used in conjunction with the National School Lunch Act (i.e., s and reduced price lunch) may be used when communicating (print, verbal, electronic or other media) this information; and
- (4) The penalties for unauthorized disclosures.

Protect the confidentiality of children's meal eligibility information status and/or socioeconomic status as follows:

School Nutrition Programs in the local School Food Authorities will furnish a file containing the names (and other identifying data) of who qualify as economically disadvantaged students only to those Testing Coordinators/Directors authorized by this MOA. Students will be identified only as economically disadvantaged and will not be identified by their free and reduced price meal eligibility status. LEA Testing Coordinators/Directors who have access to the individual EDS statuses will not release the information in any manner to other school or LEA staff except as specifically required to comply with this agreement between the School Nutrition Services and the Division of Accountability Services.

Protect the confidentiality of student's meal eligibility information and/or socioeconomic status during the transfer of information as follows:

The information about eligible students will be transferred electronically at the State level for use in accountability reporting. Electronic files will be stored securely. At the local level, a list of students qualifying for free and reduced price meals or free milk will be provided. This list will be stored securely and destroyed when it is no longer needed.

IV. EFFECTIVE DATES

This agreement shall be effective from **October 1, 2015 through July 31, 2016.**

V. PENALTIES

Any person who publishes, divulges, discloses, or makes known in any manner, or to any extent not authorized by Federal law (Section 9(b)(2)(C) of the National School Lunch Act; 42 USC 1758(8)(2)(C) or a regulation, any information about a child's eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk shall be fined not more than a \$1,000 or imprisonment of not more than 1 year or both.


VI. SIGNATURES

All parties acknowledge that children's free and reduced price meal and free milk eligibility information may be used only for the specific purposes stated above; that unauthorized use of free and reduce price meal information or further disclosure to other persons or programs is prohibited and constitutes a violation of Federal Jaw which may result in civil and criminal penalties. Disclosure of student's confidential meal eligibility status to unauthorized individuals or groups may also constitute grounds for dismissal as reflected in the legally- binding agreement between the department and the LEA.

Note: Section 9(b)(2)(C)(iv) specifies that certain programs may receive children's eligibility status only, without parental consent. Parental consent must be obtained to disclose any additional eligibility information. Section O(b)(2)(C)(iv) specifies that for State Medicaid or SCHIP, parents must be notified and given opportunity to elect not to have information disclosed. Social security numbers may only be disclosed if households are given notice of the disclosure and the uses to be made of their social security numbers as required by Sec. 7 of the Privacy Act.
